Fall 2020 in Review

Fall 2020 posed what many considered to be an interesting start to the school year. With many classes either running in hybrid format or completely online due to the coronavirus, many students - especially first-time freshmen - didn't have a typical semester. Football games and other sporting events ran at limited capacity with no tailgating allowed, and many campus spaces - such as the student center, lecture halls, and dining halls - were reimagined to accommodate for health and safety guidelines.

Despite the irregular start to the year, the Beta Epsilon chapter initiated 38 new Beta Class members, bringing the total number of chapter members up to 87. This is anticipated to reach around 100 in the Spring semester, with the upcoming Pre-Initiation and subsequent Initiation of the Gamma Class.

These brotherhood events were held in accordance Columbia coronavirus with guidelines.


